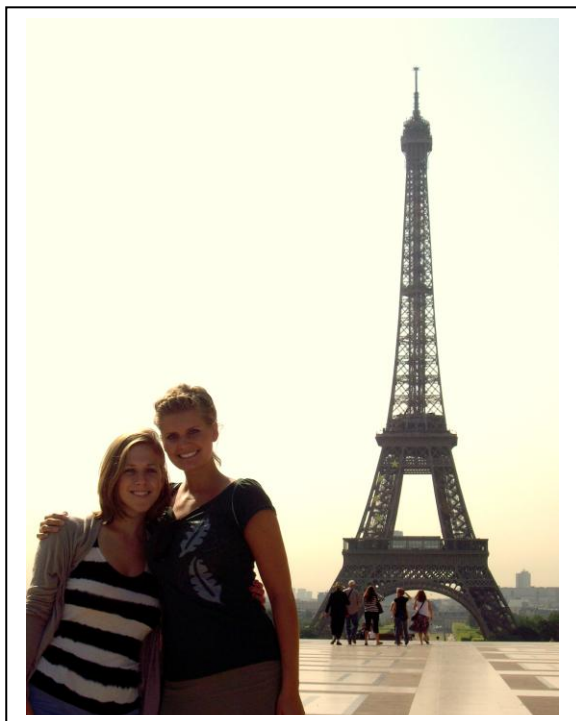
Program Description:

Paris provides an opportunity to explore firsthand the history of the styles of architecture, interiors, furnishings, and decorative arts after 1900 A.D. Visits to museums, historical structures, and more provide exposure to both historic and contemporary designs as well as cultural trends and influences.

The Paris trip examines the design of significant 20th century structures, especially as these relate to gender issues. A heavy component of the course examines the evolution of ideals of home. The program features lectures with field study in Paris and surrounding areas.

This course provides WOST credit and is open to WOST minors with the permission of Professor Prestwood.
